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Sexual Responsibility Definitions

<u>Sexual Behavior</u>: Broad spectrum of behavior in which humans display their sexuality

Sexual Responsibility: making informed decisions and safer sex choices

<u>Intimacy:</u> mental, emotional or physical closeness such as a personal remark, a warm or familiar setting or detailed knowledge

<u>Disease Prevention</u>: efforts to stop the spread of disease/infections from infecting a person

<u>Birth Control:</u> prevents pregnancy from occuring

<u>Sexually Transmitted Diseases</u>: An infection transmitted through sexual contact, caused by bacteria, viruses, or parasites

<u>Bacterial</u>: can be treated and often cured with antibiotics. Some bacterial STI's include chlamydia, gonorrhea, and syphilis

<u>Viral</u>: can be controlled, but not cured. If you get a viral STI's, you will always have it. Some viral STI's include HIV, genital herpes, human papillomavirus (HPV), strains of hepatitis

<u>Parasites:</u> an organism that lives on a host, can be cured by topical creams expubic lice

SEXUAL READINESS

Here are some questions to ask yourself BEFORE getting involved in SFXUAL INTERCOURSE....

- How do i feel about sexual intercourse? When do I think it would be right for me? Under what conditions and with what kind of person?
- How does the other person feel? How do these feelings fit with my own?
- What makes me feel I want to have intercourse right now? Is there
 any chance that I am pressuring or exploiting the other person? Could
 they be pressuring or exploiting me?
- What do I expect sexual intercourse to be like? What if it is bad and I don't enjoy it? How would I feel about myself, about my partner, about my future partners or a husband or wife?
- How would I and my partner feel if others find out about our relationship?
- Do I really TRUST my partner completely?
- What if this turns into a strictly sexual relationship and that is all we ever do- how would I feel then?
- What extra strains might there be on the relationship once we've had intercourse?
- How will I feel if we break up?
- What will I do to prevent pregnancy?
- To prevent sexually transmitted infections (STI'S)
- What would I do if a pregnancy results from having intercourse? How would I and my partner feel?
- What would I do if my partner gets an STI?
- How would my family (parents, siblings) feel if they found out about my sexual relationship? How would I feel about their knowing?

If you cannot answer all of these questions with confidence. You are not ready to engage in sexual intercourse!
